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Cefr Level A1 English Language

English test A1 (Beginner) Can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type. Can introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has.

The six levels within the CEFR are A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, and C2. These six reference levels are widely accepted as the European standard for grading an individual's proficiency in around forty different languages. Each level is divided into four kinds of competences (language skills), describing what a learner is supposed to be able to do in reading, ...

CEFR Language Levels > A1, A2, B1, B2, C1 and C2

The CEFR organises language proficiency in six levels, A1 to C2, which can be regrouped into three broad levels: Basic User, Independent User and Proficient User, and that can be further subdivided according to the needs of the local context. The levels are defined through 'can-do' descriptors.

The CEFR Levels

A1 level: a newbie. A1 is at the bottom of the CEFR language levels hierarchy. At this level, you're not too occupied with grammar and stuff. You simply concentrate on exchanging the basic information, like introducing yourself, or leading effective small talk around " where are you from " and " do you have a dog ".

The CEFR is available in 40 languages. The CEFR describes foreign language proficiency at six levels: A1 and A2, B1 and B2, C1 and C2. It also defines three 'plus' levels (A2+, B1+, B2+) The CEFR can be adapted and used for multiple contexts and applied for all languages.

Level A1 corresponds to basic users of the language, i.e. those able to communicate in everyday situations with commonly-used expressions and elementary vocabulary. It is important to bear in mind that the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is the system that defines and explains the different levels of oral and written expression and comprehension for languages such as English.

The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is an international standard for describing language ability. It describes language ability on a six-point scale, from A1 for beginners, up to C2 for those who have mastered a language.

CEF Levels The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEF or CEFR) was put together by the Council of Europe as a way of standardising the levels of language exams in different regions. It is very widely used internationally and all important exams are mapped to the CEFR. There are six levels: A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2. These are described in the table below.

The CEFR is an international guideline to measure language ability, using a scale from A1 (beginners) to C2 (language masters). There are many free online tests you can take to check your CEFR level. You can also take official language proficiency tests such as IELTS, which will give you certified proof of your English level for employers, colleges, and universities.
